Remember: Reduce – Reuse – Recycle whenever you can



Tips on Reducing, Recycling and Reusing from Braintree District Council www.braintree.gov.uk

REDUCE

It is increasingly important to reduce the amount of waste we produce and to make best use of what we already have.

This means:

- buying sustainably
- choosing re-usable products
- buying only what we need
- repairing or repurposing existing items where possible
- recycling what we no longer want
- only throwing away items that have no further use or value (either for ourselves or other people)

If we treat all our waste in this way, it will help save precious resources and minimise the impact on our local, national and global environment.

We can all make a difference by revisiting our daily habits and thinking more carefully about what we buy, whether it's food, clothing or household items. There are many easy switches that can drastically reduce the amount of waste that goes into the bin, such as:

- buying smart. Try to choose products with minimal packaging that is also recyclable; or better still, no packaging at all. Buy local where possible
- avoiding food waste: Plan your weekly meals and only buy what you actually need. Freeze what you don't use. You can use left-overs for tomorrow's lunch or dinner; there are great recipe ideas on-line

RECYCLE

You can recycle much of your waste. It is quick and easy to sort it out and put it in the right bins or sack.

Clear sacks

You can <u>use your clear sacks</u> to recycle:

- paper plastic bottles, tubs and trays tins, cans and clean foil
- plastic packaging cardboard

Braintree District Council collect clear sack recycling fortnightly from your kerbside, or weekly at communal bins.

Kerbside food bins

Braintree District Council collect food waste weekly from your kerbside food bin.

Garden waste

Braintree District Council run a fortnightly subscription based garden waste collection throughout the spring, summer and autumn.

Other waste

Glass bottles and jars can also be taken to your <u>nearest recycling centre or recycling banks</u> there is one located at The Co-Operative Store on Kelvedon High Street. Soft Plastics can also be recycled in the Co-Op lobby. Batteries can be recycled at the Co-Op or the Chemist. Small electrical items can be taken to the Library for recycling..

There are recycling banks for textiles and shoes across the district.



REUSE

Before throwing something away, why not check if someone else in the community can make use of it.

Community Use

Local community groups such as pre-school, youth clubs or other community groups can often make use of the items you no longer need.

Charity Shops

You can donate unwanted items to charity shops. They accept:

- clothing books children's toys shoes bric-a-brac
- bags and accessories DVDs CDs and vinyl paintings

Some also accept unwanted furniture.

Please check with your local charity shop beforehand to see what they will accept.

Textile Banks

There are several textile banks across the district.

You can find out more about where they are and what you can take to them.

Online Groups

Online platforms are a great way to support your local community and save you having to throw items away. The types of items you can give and receive online include:

- furniture
- clothing
- children's toys
- soil and rubble
- pre-loved garden ornaments

You can pass almost anything on.

Freegle

It's easy and free to join Freegle. You can join your local Freegle group today:

- Braintree Freegle
- Sudbury and Braintree Freegle

Or you can check other groups like Freecycle or Preloved or Facebook.

Swishing

This is an ethical, eco-fabulous, social and fun way to swap an item or items of clothing, shoes, and accessories with friends and acquaintances.

Parties must willingly give an item to participate in the transaction, then they are free to choose something of interest from what others have offered.

<u>From George & Gwyn</u>: "Don't forget to save your lighter plastic food wrappings – Coop have a special bin for them".

<u>From Jim & Lynn:</u> Reuse your old Egg Cartons to start of your Spring and Summer seedlings, just fill with compost/soil plant your seeds and keep damp until they start to sprout then transfer the little sections into bigger plant pots. Plastic Plant Pots can also be Recycled at Garden Centres or why not offer them to someone else.
