ECO Church Awards

We continue our journey in trying to achieve the Silver Eco-Church award (we have already got the Bronze award). The online Eco-Church questionnaire has 5 headings;

- 1. Worship & Teaching
- 2. Buildings
- 3. Land
- 4. Community & Global Engagement
- 5. Lifestyle

We have already achieved Silver status for the first 4 of those headings, yet for lifestyle we are still at the Bronze award level. When we are talking about lifestyle, we are talking about the lifestyle of the individuals that are our church. In the Newsletter for the last 2 months, we have encouraged people to walk to Church (if they are able to, weather permitting) and last month Jim outlined the various recycling facilities that are available for us all.

Over the coming months we will continue to raise awareness of various aspects of our lifestyle and we will encourage you to look at your lifestyle.
